ABOUT US

Integrated Project for Development of People (IPDP) marked its beginning in the year 2004 by a handful number of social workers and likeminded people, who always wish to serve the poor, marginalized, disadvantaged and other vulnerable people in the society. The main focus was on education, health, basic amenities for the needy in the community, vocational training in order to create awareness on women empowerment as well as child rights. The exact plan was successfully executed through trainings, workshops and direct exposure visits through a sustainable approach including participative intervention in the community. Services and Awareness is always our top priority in all of our programs. Our role as a Facilitator between the Community and the Government has successfully yielded fruitful results. We organize various kinds of awareness programs for the slum communities. We have always made sure to get the community ready to fight for their demands from the concerned departments.

SELF HELP GROUPS



IPDP has been running savings and credit program for the women in slums and other needy communities. Under this project we have formed and promoted 1894 SHGs , New SHG groups formed are about 303, which sums upto 22000 members in various areas of Bengaluru. Urban District, Chanpatna Ramnagar district ,Tiptur Taluk and Tumkur District. We are guiding SHGs to manage and maintain their activities properly without default. Our coordinators mainly play the role of facilitators between Self Help Groups and ICICI Bank. We have recommended a minimum sum of Rs.1.5 lakh to a maximum sum of Rs. 15 lakh per group to ICICI Bank. This year we organized ICICI Bank loans which amounts to more than Rs. 34,01,28,000 for SHGs in the current financial year.

AKSHARA DASOHA (MID DAY MEAL)



IPDP is successfully running Akshara Dasoha Mid-day Meal program for 80 schools that includes Government school & Government-aided schools in Nandini layout, Sondekoppa, Yelahanka, Rajanukunte, Devanahalli ,Ullal Upanagar, Hegganahalli, Laggere & Vidhyaranyapura clusters in Bengaluru. North, Urban District. The main objective of this scheme is to reduce the number of dropouts and to increase the enrollment in Government schools. This scheme is introduced by the Government of India and the Government of Karnataka with the sharing of 60:40. 1-5 standard includes 6324 children & 6-10 standard includes a total of 5684 children. The monitoring, supervising and execution of this scheme comes under Zilla Panchayat. Successfully through our Mid-Day Meal Scheme about 12,008 children are getting benefited every single day.

ASHAKIRANA RESIDENTIAL HOSTEL CHILDREN IN CRISIS PROJECT



While working with the slum communities, we found that there is a need for residential shelter for children in crisis . IPDP initiated Ashakirana Residential Shelter at Jaibhuvaneshwari nagar in the year 2006 especially for the poor children with the support of Sarva Shikshana Abhiyana (SSA) Government of India. We accommodate about 50 children between the age group of 6-16 to continue their formal education. We make sure to provide basic amenities like food ,shelter and clothing to support overall development of the children . The main aim of the program is to mainstream the school dropout children to formal schooling . All our hostel Children are enrolled in Sri Veena vidya samasthe from 2nd Standard to 10th Standard to continue their studies. This Program is supported by MCKS Trust Fund and Weir Minerals India Pvt Ltd.

FEEDING PROGRAM FOR HEALTH CAMP



Dr. Ramana Rao's renowned free village clinic at T. Begur in Nelamangala taluk (Bengaluru. Rural District) is offering free medical services for poor rural citizens since 1974 and is conducting free health checkup camps where about 1000 patients are treated in village clinic. With the support of MCKS TRUST FUND we cook and supply food for about 1000 health camp patients every Sunday. The patients come from local areas from 25 to 50 km distance to get free medical support and treatment from this health camp .

FEEDING PROGRAM FOR SENIOR CITIZENS - MID DAY MEAL



While working with the slum communities we were approached by a group of elderly people who requested for atleast one meal daily due to their family situations which kept them hungry till almost evening daily. This was our starting point, considering their request we came up with a plan of providing lunch to elderly people every day & haven't looked back . We are supported by MCKS TRUST FUND to provide one meal every day to the elderly. We are successfully running this program since 2015. We are happy that 300 elderly people are getting benefited every day in Kaveri Nagar, Lakshmi Devi Nagar Colony and Sanjay Gandhi Nagar slums in Bengaluru. Urban District.

PRE PRIMARY EDUCATION CENTER



IPDP has initiated Early Childhood Care and Education program for children ranging from 3-6 years by providing pre-primary education especially for poor children in slum areas. The main objective of the program is to prevent malnutrition and to improve the health condition of the children. The program also aims to provide basic education for the poor. We started creche program at Jaibhuvaneshwari nagar and successfully promoted 1021 children to formal schools from 2004-2024.

SKILL TRAINING PROGRAM -SOFT SKILLS & HEALTH CARE TRAINING



IPDP has executed Skill Training Program since 2014 successfully where we provide free trainings and job placements for the underprivileged youth aged between 18-35. We train them on banking and financial service insurance, basics in computer, spoken English, personality development, retail management and career counseling. This program is supported by Smile Foundation in Shrike in Bengaluru. and 3 skill training centers in Tiptur , Huliyaara & Channapatna are supported by MCKS Food For The Hungry Foundation Karnataka & Vedanta foundation . So far we have trained 2988 youth out of which 2241 have been successfully placed in different professions based on their abilities and interests.

SKILL TRAINING PROGRAM - TRAINING ON TAILORING



We started our free tailoring training in 2019 for 40 students which comprised of 2 batches with 20 students each. Within a years time about 120 students got promoted to various jobs and self-employment opportunities opened up for their livelihoods. Around 269 women beneficiaries are trained until now. We humbly began which made our collaboration with Weir Mineral India Pvt Ltd successful. In Alur gram panchayath underprivileged women aged between 18-40 were able to find a good job & earn their living. We are in the process to tie up with other big entities in order to take our tailoring program initiatives to the next level.

EMPOWERMENT PROGRAM FOR SHG WOMEN (FINANCIAL LITERACY,LEGAL AWARENESS , BUSINESS MELA)



We organized legal awareness programs to our SHG Women at Tiptur under the guidance of Mrs. Shobha Jaydev. She gave more insights on violations of women rights & ways to approach and resolve their problems in families / workplaces. Many inputs with examples on how they can overcome problems, resolve them at their levels were highlighted. If need be suggestions and advices from SHG members through the concerned coordinators can be approached further from Advocate & legal advisor Tiptur. SHG women were made available for legal assistance on domestic violence, mental tortures and physical harassments for women. It is saddening that many women face lots of problems but they find it hard to bring them to the limelight. They suppress their emotions and suffer internally instead of overcoming it. The SHGs are a pillar of support to them. In case of extremities we have referred and connected them to women rights organization and we are happy to report that many of them have got solutions this way. We have created opportunities for women to run small businesses & we annually conducted business mela to improve local marketing and networking. Parallely we conducted awareness on menstrual hygiene and interactive competitions on International women's day to encourage women's participation. This project is supported by Target corporation India Pvt Ltd.

FEEDING SUPPORT FOR STREET VENDORS



Joint initiatives with Excel Charitable Trust for creating hunger free world as our objective we actively supported by providing food to the needy people. They came up with a concept of feeding street vendors where around 150 were shortlisted. The street vendors had to come early in the morning from various places skipping their breakfast for the purpose of their living which impacted their health adversely . Street vendors like flower & vegetable sellers, tea & cloth distributors , artificial jewelry vendors , street book vendors, homeless people (sleeping in the footpath),few BBMP helpers, gas vehicle drivers, auto drivers etc., are benefited through this project.

Renovation of Government Pre- Primary School (Nagarur)





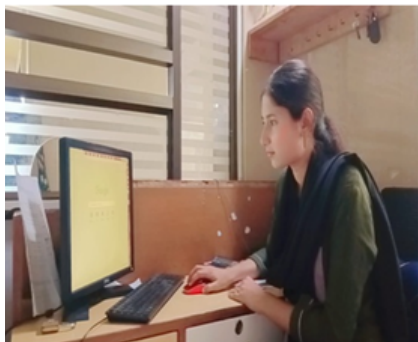
Integrated project for development of people has started its renovation work in Nagarur Government School from May 2023 .We planned for renovation by providing chairs to the office room ,we also focused on renovating the restroom for boys and girls, providing green boards to all classrooms, Nali kali tables, chairs, related charts. Slogans were written on compound walls and painting of entire school building was done including all classrooms, we infact provided sweaters to all 85 children. Our main aim was to improve the standard of education at the rural area setting for which we supported in enhancing various infrastructure facilities with cleanness, hygiene and good environment for children to continue their education.This project is entirely supported by Weir minerals ilndia Pvt Ltd .

VOLUNTEERING ACTIVITY



IPDP have been creating a platform for volunteers towards community development and creating a lot of opportunities for volunteering activities like International environment day celebration, providing SSLC Coaching, distributing bags ,books & other study materials through donation drives.

With my salary I'm able to take care of my family expenses and save some money. I'm very happy to help my family. Kalpashree says she is 25 years old qualified with PUC. This is her first job after the training. STeP has improved her confidence level after completion of her STeP Healthcare program.



Manjunath aged 17 years has moved to Bengaluru. with his parents from Yadagir in his early childhood in search of their livelihood. His parents were farmers struck by drought. Manjunath was 14 years old then. His parents were struggling to settle down in Bengaluru. city. It was difficult for them to meet their needs but they wanted to add value and good education to their lives. His parents were looking for a school & shelter for both of their children, when IPDP was in the process of admitting students from under privileged families for their Ashakirana Program. At the same time, through a middle man his parents got in touch with us and enrolled him .He is glad that the IPDP could provide him good education, nutritious meals and also encouraged him in co-curricular activities like sports , yoga and so on. He scored 76% in his SSLC examination which could boost his confidence to continue with his further education. He now has joined for 1st PUC in a Government PU College. This opportunity helped him to become independent and support his family. Thus, IPDP has played a vital role in shaping his career. He expresses his immense gratitude towards Weir minerals India Pvt Ltd, MCKS trust fund , IPDP and is thankful to Beema Sir (Director of IPDP) from the bottom of his heart.

Hi I'm Sameer i was a student in Ashakirana hostel for 3 years from 2017. Previously we lived in a shed having no proper shelter. We are a family of 4 & my parents are daily wage workers . My parents wished to give us good education and food but unfortunately they were unable to afford those. We came across Ashakirana residential hostel which provides free education, shelter and food after which we approached Beema sir and warden for an opportunity through which I could continue my education .Today i'm pursuing final year Degree (B.Com) and working part-time at KFC as IDI to help my family for their daily living . I express my sincere gratitude towards MCKS Trust fund ,Weir minerals India Pvt Ltd, IPDP and is thankful to Beema Sir (Director of IPDP) from the bottom of his heart.
